Homelessness Does Not Know a Gender, But Sometimes Resources Do

By necessity, many resources designed to assist the homeless are divided. (women only shelters, men only shelters, shelters for youth, etc.) However, this will often create barriers to access for parents with children around the age of 12. At that point, most shelters will require that the family split between males and females for the safety of the children.

Community of Hope provides an extremely important opportunity: for families to stay together. This helps to reduce trauma to the entire family system - especially the kids.
